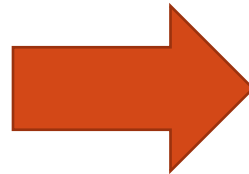

- Long time no see.
- It's been a while.
- It's been a long time.
- It's been such a long time.
- It's been too long.
- I'm so happy to see you again.
- Wow, it's so good to see you again!
- What have you been up to?

# Answers

- (I'm) fine, thanks. And you?
- Good.
- Very well
- I'm O.K.
- So so.
- Not (too) bad
- Great!
- I'm doing very well, thank you. And you?
- I'm fine. Thank you
- Great, thanks. How are you?
- Not bad. You?

- Wonderful, thank you

## Example

- The sun rises from the east.
- She drinks a glass of wine everyday.
- The flower shop opens at 9'O clock from Monday to Saturday.

# Present Tense

Affirmative	Negative	Question
I smile	I do not/ don't smile	Do I smile?
You smile	You do not/ don't smile	Do You smile?
He, she, it smiles	He, she, it does not/ doesn't smile	Does he, she, it smile?
We smile	We do not/ don't smile	Do we smile?
They smile	They do not/ don't smile	Do they smile?
