However, the students are not allowed to copy all the

content they retrieve from the Internet, but they are taught to rewrite the content by applying the lessons.

- (9) The lecturer makes students feel comfortable about asking questions.
- (10) Course assignments are interesting and stimulating.
- (11) The lecturer uses technology to enhance learning in the classroom.
- 2.2 The director/ head of program construct assessment items to evaluate four dimensions of lecturer's competencies: teaching skills, organization and presentation of materials, management of the learning environment, and teaching attitudes

#### 3. Teaching Revision

Lecturer revises teaching/ learning process based on the results from the students' survey questions, the lecturer team's observation, and classroom research.

#### 4. Feedback for Achievement Standards

International College Administrator Committee monitors the assessment process and grading.

### 5. Methodology and Planning for Course Review and Improvement

- (1) Revise and develop course structure and process every three years.
- (2) Assign different lecturers teach this course to enhance students' performance.
