Parts of them were secondary consorts and concubines, but most of them were appointed to specific tasks in the management of the private quarters of the imperial palace. 	
Century	noun	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Communication changed hugely in the 20th century. - Prophets have been forecasting the end of the world for centuries. - Let's look ahead to the next century. - A century ago, this was just a small farm town. - In the 19th century, the number of immigrants increased rapidly. - Finally free of Japanese interference, Korea elected its first autonomous government in almost half a century.

Burma	proper noun	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The ruling military junta changed its name from Burma to Myanmar in 1989, a year after thousands were killed in the suppression of a popular uprising. Rangoon also became Yangon. - Myanmar, also called Burma, country, located in the western portion of mainland Southeast Asia. In 1989 the country's official English name was changed from the Union of Burma to the Union of Myanmar. - The siege of Ayutthaya began during the first Chinese invasion of Burma. The Siamese believed that if they could hold out until the rainy season, the seasonal flooding of the Siamese central plain would force a retreat. But King Hsinbyushin (พระเจ้ามังกระ- King Mangra) of Burma believed that the Chinese war was a minor border dispute, and continued the siege.
